### MATHER SWINGS INTO SUMMER WITH RESILIENCE AND HEART

Big things are happening in the small but mighty community of Mather! Thanks to incredible local fundraising efforts, a dedicated fundraising committee and some support from Cartwright-Roblin Municipality, Mather is moving forward with an exciting upgrade to its park playground – a project rooted in safety, imagination, and community pride.


The two-phase project will begin this spring with the installation of brand-new CSA-approved playground equipment, including a climbing structure, teeter-totter, and updated swing set. A professionally prepared fall-safe zone, using sand and pea gravel, will ensure a safe and durable play area for children of all ages – from locals to visitors returning with young families. Phase two, planned for later in 2025, will feature natural wood play structures like a playhouse, discovery ship, and sandbox – all designed to encourage creative and interactive play.

What makes this project truly special is that every dollar was raised through local donations, sponsorships, and a federal grant through “From the Ground Up”. With volunteer labor and in-kind support from community members and local contractors, Mather continues to prove that when people come together with purpose and heart, anything is possible.

Stay tuned for progress updates and a celebration when the new playground opens – a proud symbol of Mather’s resilience and dedication to its future generations.






